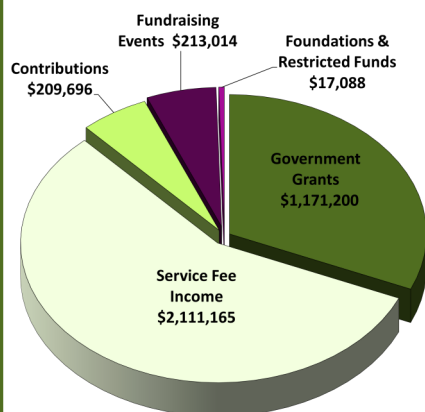
## Our Mission

Greenleaf Family Center strengthens families in our community through counseling, education and support.

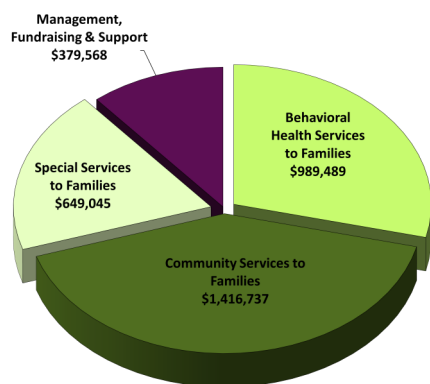
## Year in Review

Greenleaf supported an unprecedented number of clients in 2022, over 40% more than the prior year, as we continued to respond to the community's challenges coming out of COVID. More individuals, especially young people, are experiencing depression, anxiety and suicidal thoughts. With generous support from our partners, funders and community, we were able to achieve the following outcomes and we are grateful.

**17,750** - Total unduplicated clients

- 1** **11,338** - Students participated in **Suicide Prevention** programs in 36 schools.
- 2** **1,853** - Adults trained to identify **Signs of Suicide**
- 3** **2,141** - Individuals received **Mental Health Counseling**
  - **429** couples/family sessions
  - **338** students sessions, on-site in their school
  - **655** assessments for counseling in lieu of conviction at the request of the court
- 4** **317** - Families provided assistance by a **Parent Advocate** to support their child with multiple special needs
- 5** **787** - **Deaf and Hard of Hearing individuals** received interpreting services
- 6** **338** - Families received infant **nutrition, health and safety supplies**

## A message from Dawn Glenny, our CEO

While still working through the challenges of COVID, 2022 was a good year for Greenleaf. We expanded many of our existing programs to serve more families and individuals, and received funding for a new program, the Family Success Network. This program is a family support service program, and we are appreciative of funding by the Ohio Children's Trust Fund to provide the program.

As was the national trend, we saw an increase in the number of children, adolescents and adults who are experiencing higher levels of anxiety, depression, and suicidal thoughts and we work tirelessly to provide increased supports to our clients to address these issues.

We are eternally grateful to the people in our community who support our programs through unrestricted donations which allow us to increase capacity in our programs.

## Program Highlights:



Parent Advocate program participants STRONGLY agreed that "since becoming involved with PEERS, I feel better able to advocate for my child's needs."



1,100 middle and high school students requested assistance for themselves or a friend following in-school Signs of Suicide presentations.



After receiving education pertaining to infant safe sleep, car seat and/or stroller safety, parents increased their knowledge from 84% to 100%.



Over \$239,000 in infant nutrition, health and safety supplies was distributed to 338 families.



We began planning for our new Family Success Network, a free, family support program that includes family coaching, parenting tips, money management, financial assistance for parenting needs, and connections to additional community supports to help families succeed.



We were awarded a contract to provide financial assistance to provide behavioral health counseling to clients without insurance.



We increased our presence in the schools and case management services for students to ensure better care coordination and expanded services.

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
