Looking Forward to 2023 From our CEO, Dawn Glenny

2023 will be an exciting year at Greenleaf Family Center. As 2022 came to a close and we began the new year, Greenleaf:

- Hired our Chief Program Officer, a newly created position. We welcome Joan Davidson!
- Hired our first of two Family Coaches for our Family Success Network (FSN)
 program. We welcome Shannon Jackson! The FSN is a child abuse and prevention
 initiative new to Greenleaf which collaborates with more than 20 community
 agencies to provide support (family led), to assist families at risk for child abuse and
 neglect. FSN will officially begin on July 1.
- Hired the Family Success Network Program Manager and extend our welcome to Tabitha Mazza!
- Received new funding from United Way of Summit and Medina Counties to support our infant vitality program, mental health programs, parent advocacy, and suicide prevention efforts.
- Hosted our 14th Night at the Races, with great success as you will see below!

Through this pandemic we have met the challenges head on, both for staff and the clients we are privileged to serve in this community.

Greenleaf is nationally accredited through the Council on Accreditation and this year we will start working on the renewal of our national reaccreditation planning process. We have also started an exciting project with the University of Akron Sociology Department to engage students in a deeper understanding of data collection, analysis, and grant writing with several goals in mind. We want to enrich the experience the students have, linking the relationships between career exploration and the importance of grant making, foundation support, and data collection and analysis for program improvement.

We will also strengthen our performance quality improvement (PQI) process using this data which will enable our Leadership Team to strengthen the programs and services we provide to our clients. PQI is a critical process to continuously evaluate and improve program and administrative performance, one we robustly attack.

The third week of January I had the opportunity to attend a two-day Racial Equity Institute training. I continue to seek out opportunities to enrich my knowledge in relevant areas in our community to enhance or modify programming we offer to provide the best support to our community that we can.

I wish to thank every person, foundation, and grantor who supports the work of this organization. Without the support of each of you, we could not do the important work we do in our community.
