Our New Family Success Network will Launch July 1

Greenleaf Family Center is excited to announce that on July 1, we are launching a new program called the Family Success Network (FSN), funded by Ohio Children's Trust Fund. This program is

designed to strengthen families and provide caregivers with support to achieve their goals. The program staff, known as Family Coaches, will help families navigate systems by connecting them with available services in their community. Every family will have access to a Family Coach that can offer interested families financial assistance, support managing parenting struggles, and creating a personalized family success plan.

Our staff has been working with agencies all throughout Summit County to develop an appropriate implementation into the community. The way we view the Family Success Network is that it MUST be community and partnership-based to be the most successful. We also find that the beauty of this program is that it is family-leading, meaning that there are no requirements to the program and every decision is made by the caregivers. Our staff works closely with families in the areas they want support in, and we encourage families to be their best.

Here at Greenleaf, we believe in strengthening families and our core values align with the mission of the Family Success Network. We could not be more excited to launch this program into Summit County and see how the families in our community can thrive when they have everything they need to be successful.

Greenleaf in the Community

Our Prevention Manager, Daniel Bennett, participated in an educational and compassionate session regarding mental health at the **Rotary Club of Akron**'s District Conference on Friday, April 28. Daniel was on a panel with mental health experts from Northeast Ohio to discuss how mental health needs have shifted following the COVID-19 pandemic, the disparate impact being felt by marginalized and vulnerable populations, and the role each of us can play in helping to reduce the stigma associated with seeking help.



Mark Byrd, Advocacy and Support Service Coordinator for our Community Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CSD) program, led two educational sessions for first responders on Deaf culture, basic American Sign Language (ASL) communication and best practices when working with a Deaf victim.
