Our New Program Family Success Network

Greenleaf Family Center was selected by the Ohio Children's Trust Fund to pilot a county-wide child abuse/neglect prevention program, the Family Success Network (FSN), beginning in 2023. FSN is a community-based prevention model that offers services to families and children at risk of becoming involved with the child welfare system. Through a multi-tiered approach, this program offers an array of services to at risk families. From one-time consultations to intensive home visiting services, families can select the frequency and duration of services that will best meet their unique needs and help them to achieve their goals.

The FSN rests on six pillars of service categories that are offered through the program: family coaching, parent education, basic life skills, financial literacy, service referrals, and concrete supports. Through this holistic, family-centered, solution-focused approach families will be supported by specially trained 'family coaches' to increase their protective factors and adopt new behaviors to strengthen their family unit and mitigate risk factors for child abuse and neglect.

September is Suicide Prevention Month

September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month — a time to raise awareness on this stigmatized, and often taboo, topic. You are not alone! Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for individuals age 10-34 and the 12th cause of death overall in the US. Connecting with others is a strong protective factor that reduces risk for suicide. Announcing Our New Teen LGBTQ+ Support Group

We proud to announce our upcoming Teen LGBTQ+ Support Group. Access to affirming and inclusive spaces for LGBTQ+ teens is critical to their mental and emotional wellbeing. In the Trevor Project's National Survey on LGBTQ Youth Mental Health 2021, it was reported that 72% of LGBTQ+ youth reported symptoms of clinical anxiety and 62% reported symptoms of depression. Additionally, the survey found that LGBTQ+ youth who identified having access to spaces which affirm their sexual orientation and gender identity report lower rates of suicide attempts.




We also participated in the Akron Pride Festival and Parade on Aug. 27. We proudly support our LGBTQ+ community through counseling, education and support.









Community Strengths Tree Project

Our Prevention Department has been out in the community this summer working on a special project—A Community Strengths Tree. Substance Use Prevention Education Resource Program (SUPER)

SUPER program is an indicated, substance use prevention program designed to implement early intervention with adults who are showing or engaging in risk behaviors, but do not meet the substance use disorder diagnosis. The goal of this program is to provide education and skills to decrease the likelihood that substance misuse will rise to the level of abuse in the future.

SUPER is a one time, 3-hour course led by prevention facilitators, or those who possess prevention certification as recognized through the Chemical Dependency Board of Ohio. SUPER was created to fill a need in our community and is grant funded by the County of Summit ADM board allowing participants to attend the program at no cost.


